Adjunct Faculty in Audiology for Communications Sciences and Disorders

The University seeks an Adjunct Instructor (Audiologist) for its Communication Sciences and Disorders program in the School of Nursing and Health Sciences.

Qualifications for candidates:

- **Credentials**: Ohio licensure in audiology; ASHA Certificate of Clinical Competence in Audiology
- **Specialty areas**: Speech and Hearing Science/Audiology, knowledge of the physics of speech sound transmission and perception, and effects of hearing loss and amplification on human communication.

Responsibilities for this position include:

- Teach CSD4013 Audiometry (3 credit hours) in Fall 2017
- Challenge, engage, serve, and communicate with students to encourage their participation and learning while maintain mutual value and respect
- Post grades in a timely manner
- Respond to students' questions in a timely manner
- Identify and refer at-risk students to CSD program coordinator
- Ensure course and program learning outcomes are delivered as defined by the syllabus

Expectations for the successful candidate:

- Evangelical Christian confession of faith and experience (Statement of Faith required at application)
- Values and beliefs compatible with Wesleyan tradition
- Expertise in interpersonal and oral presentation/written communication skills

In a continuing effort to enrich its academic environment and provide equal educational and employment opportunities, the university actively encourages applications from members of all ethnic groups underrepresented in higher education. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled; however, early application is strongly advised.
