

POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT Adjunct Instructor – Communication Sciences and Disorders

- Deliver high quality instructions for assigned course as specified by the master syllabus and as directed by the CSD Program Director
- Challenge, engage, serve, and communicate with students to encourage their participation and learning while maintaining mutual value and respect
- Post grades in a timely manner
- Identify and refer at-risk students to CSD Program Director

Expectations for the successful candidate:

- Evangelical Christian confession of faith and experience (Statement of Faith required at application)
- Candidate must have obtained at least a conferred Master's Degree from an accredited U.S. college/university or international equivalent in Speech-Language Pathology or a related field; additional requirements driven by state licensing or accreditation considerations may apply
- ASHA Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech Language Pathology
- Experience teaching at the college level
- Expertise in interpersonal and oral presentation/written communication skills
- Engaging classroom style and appreciation of successful instructional approaches for a range of academic abilities
