

## POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT Nursing Adjunct

- Evangelical Christian confession of faith and experience (Statement of Faith required at application)
- Master of Science in Nursing from an accredited U.S. college/university required; additional requirements driven by state licensing or accreditation considerations may apply
- Active, unrestricted Ohio RN license; Advanced Practice preferred
- Experience teaching at the college level, preferred
- Expertise in interpersonal and oral presentation/written communication skills
- Commitment to quality academic instruction
- Proven ability to work collaboratively with others
