



There are 14 ministries called CoSMO (Community Service and Ministry Opportunities). These groups serve children, teens, the developmentally disabled, and the elderly. In 2021-2022, more than 250 students were involved.

The Campus Ministries division conducts all corporate chapel experiences, freshmen small groups, upper division student mentoring, critical conversations, justice talks, and partner with the Campus Life division on the wellness program.
